Dear ASTAG members

At the 25 November 2019 workshop, the Department agreed to revise the One Health Master Action Plan (OHMAP) by incorporating ASTAG feedback from the survey and workshop. Please find attached the revised OHMAP (**Attachment A**) for information and advice on next steps.

#### **OHMAP and supporting documents**

In the revised OHMAP, there is a total of 68 Focus Areas (a large decrease from the previous total of 101) including 57 revised, and 5 new Focus Areas. Amendments to Focus Areas addressed gaps, broadened sector coverage, clarified intent and identified more appropriate actions. All changes and the rationale for the changes has been documented (**Attachment B**) and de-identified feedback ASTAG member feedback compiled (**Attachment C**) for your information.

The revised OHMAP also contains a new Introduction and Glossary. Definitions have been taken from the 2020 Strategy for consistency. New definitions (that did not appear in the 2020 Strategy) have been drafted by the Departments of Health, Department of Agriculture and Water Resources and Food Standards Australia New Zealand as relevant.

#### **Next steps**

Previously, the Department had proposed to undertake a public consultation for the OHMAP. However, after incorporating the feedback provided by ASTAG, considering (and where relevant, incorporating) the feedback provided through last year's public consultation process, the Department has determined that an additional public consultation for the OHMAP is not necessary. Following internal approval processes, graphic design and type setting, the Department proposes to publish the OHMAP later this year.
